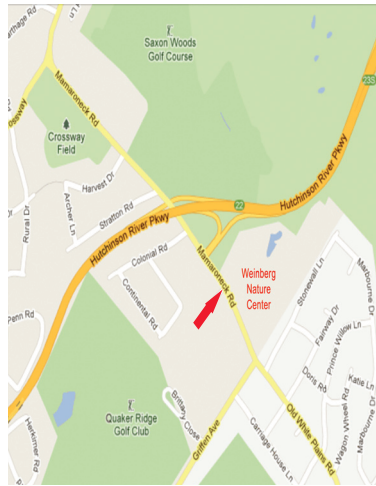
About Weinberg Nature Center

Weinberg Nature Center was founded in 1958 and is part of the Village of Scarsdale Parks, Recreation and Conservation Department. Weinberg's Trilside Museum sits among 10 acres of protected wildlife sanctuary and can be explored from our trails.

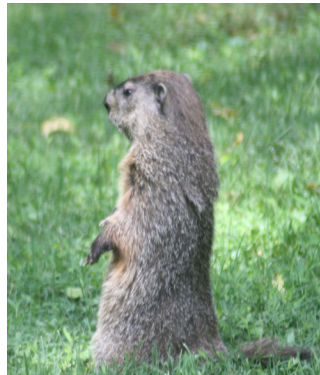

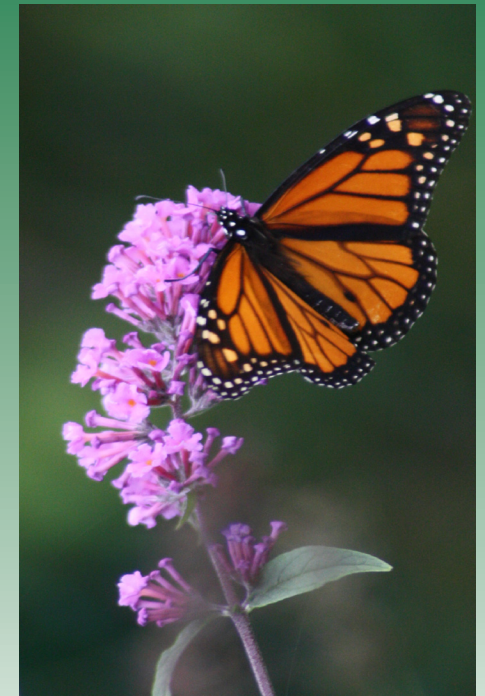
